	5:30-7:30pm, we want to listen to you. It will be a facilitated discussion to understand what may be
	challenging for youth. Working with the Mayor's office to see if there are different ways to compile/gather
	different information. Then can give evidence-based solution. (Earl) Can you share any of the factors that
	impact the youth? (Andrea) We ask about sleep, time outside, physical activity, drug/alcohol abuse, trusted
	adults, self-awareness, school environment, family support, etc. (Danielle) Where can I get the data?
	(Andrea) It will be on our website but for us to have data in other communities they must request. (Earl)
	Will you include the website in the newsletter? (Kendall) Yes. (Jacob) A stat that stood out to me was, 58%
	of kids don't have a trusted adult in their life. That shocked me. (Kendall) Thank you for joining us and
	providing information. Next steps, promote and attend the listening session. Is that accurate? (Andrea)
	Please come to that and share with others, <u>RSVP</u> and if there are other things happening in the community
	we'll let you know. (Kati) When is the next listening session? (Andrea) Feb 13, 5:30 at Meridian City Hall.

		signatures on a ballot initiative to legalize marijuana in Idaho, had two people testify and one of their

(TIME 59:40 – explanation of Kind Idaho and decriminalize of drugs). Download and watch the video recording <u>HERE</u> . (Susie) The vote was 10-4. I read Monte Stiles stuff, writes about how people are opposing the bill, he said "HB 7 would create a mandatory minimum fine of \$300 for marijuana possession under 3 ounces. In addition to strong testimony in favor of the bill, many committee members voiced strong commitment in keeping Idaho safe from the nonsense experienced elsewhere because of foolish laws and policies. The debate included powerful arguments against the legalization of drugs as well as the need to send a strong message of deterrence to users as well as those who sell marijuana. Ironically, much of the testimony against the bill was based upon the "extreme financial hardship" of paying a \$300 fine, especially by those considered indigent. This was largely blown out of the water by Representatives Hill, Hawkins and others who pointed out the average cost of a single ounce of pot was \$240!!! Boo hoo." Also, I forgot to mention the Elks trailer took a trophy in the parade this year. (Kendall) If law enforcement continued to write citations and prosecutors prosecuted maybe this discussion wouldn't even be happening. I have not seen any other drug legislation that has been introduced thus far. Find your legislator here and let them know how you feel about this policy.
